What is Title I?

Shiloh High School is identified as a Title I school as part of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 (ESEA). Title I is designed to support State and local school reform efforts tied to challenging state academic standards in reinforcing and enhancing efforts to improve teaching and learning for students. Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support parental involvement. All Title I schools must jointly develop with all parents a written parental involvement policy.

School Plan for Shared Student Achievement

What is it? In order to create an equal partnership between the school and parents to improve student academic achievement, the school and parents will jointly create a parental involvement policy. • Advertise opportunities for parents to be involved in the planning, review, and improvement of Title I programs by means of parent workshops, informal conversations, parent referrals, along with advertising through flyers, emails, phone calls, school newsletter, school website, school app, and social media sites (Facebook/Twitter).

• Administer an Annual Title I Parent Survey in order to receive parent feedback regarding the effectiveness of the school's Title I program and to determine the need for possible revisions or changes to the program.

• Shiloh High School will provide parents an opportunity to participate in the "All In" Volunteer Program for the 2015 -2016 school year to participate in events such as Annual Title I Parent Meeting, Curriculum Night, Math Night, Language Arts Night, Social Studies Night, and Math Night, and club and sporting events.

Who is it for? All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families, are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this policy. Shiloh High School will provide as many opportunities as possible for the participation of parents with limited English proficiency, parents with disabilities, and parents of migratory children. Information will be provided in a family friendly language and format.

Where is it available?

Shiloh High School disseminates the Title I information at the beginning of the school year to every student and as new students register after the school year begins.

2015-2016 Goals of Gwinnett County Public Schools:

Language Arts: All students will graduate as analytical readers, writers, and communicators of language.

Shiloh High School will increase the cohort graduation rate from 65% in 2014-2015 to 72% in 2015-2016.

Shiloh High School first time Gateway testers will increase mean scores of 495 (2015) to 500 (2016) in Science and 516 (2015) to 521 (2016) in Social Studies.

Shiloh High School's student performance on the Coordinate Algebra and Geometry Milestone exams will increase in students who meet the standard from 49% (2015) to meet or exceed the district average in (2016) in Coordinate Algebra and 57% (2015) to meet or exceed the district average in (2016) in Geometry.
